I am going to Melbourne Museum today for the Romp and Stomp Event.

There will be lots of activities with lots of people.



There might already be a lot of people outside the Museum, waiting to go inside.



When I arrive a staff member will greet us.



We may have already bought our tickets. A staff member will scan them for us.



We may have to buy our tickets at the Museum. We may have to wait in a line.

I might like to wear my headphones.



If I have forgotten my headphones, I can borrow some from the Museum.

They have sensory bags that that I can borrow from the ticket desk.



I might see butterflies and beetles in the Bugs Alive Gallery.



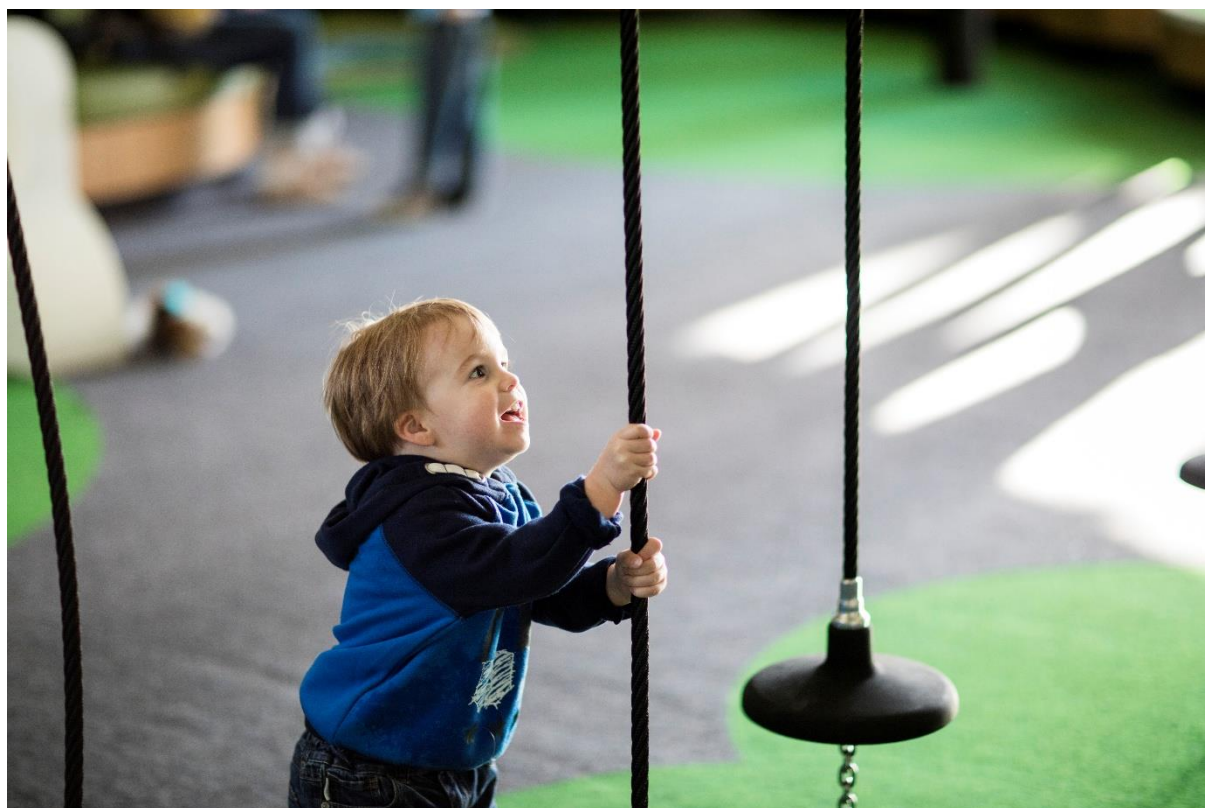
If I want to visit the Children's Gallery I will need to have a ticket.

A staff member will let me know when it is time to leave.

It's important that we put our shoes back on when we leave the Children's Gallery.

I can read about them before my visit. There are stories on the website.

The Museum could be loud and there might be a lot of people, but there are quiet spaces for me to sit down.



If I have questions or need help, I can talk to a museum staff member.



I might go to the café. We might buy some food or drinks.
We might have to line up to pay for our food or drinks.



When I visit the Museum, I might need to use the toilet.



There are hand dryers in the toilet. Some people use them after they wash their hands.



When it is time to leave, I will leave through the shop.
Sometimes we buy things in shops, sometimes we don't.
