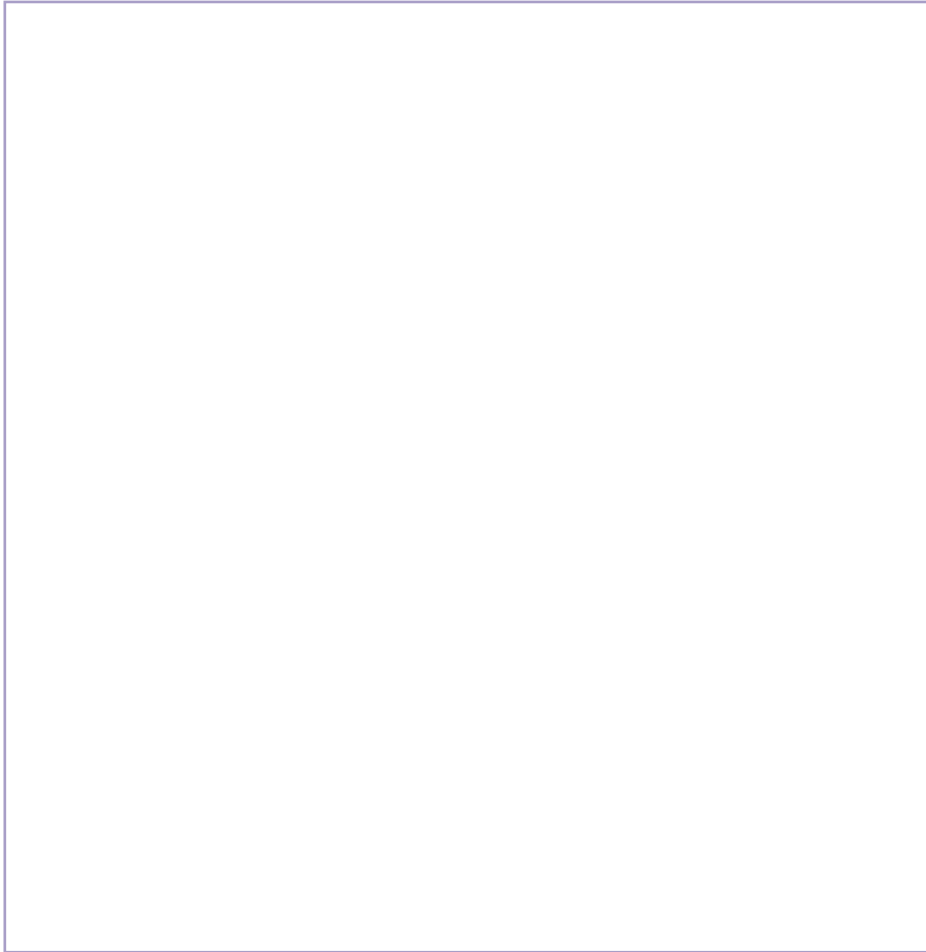

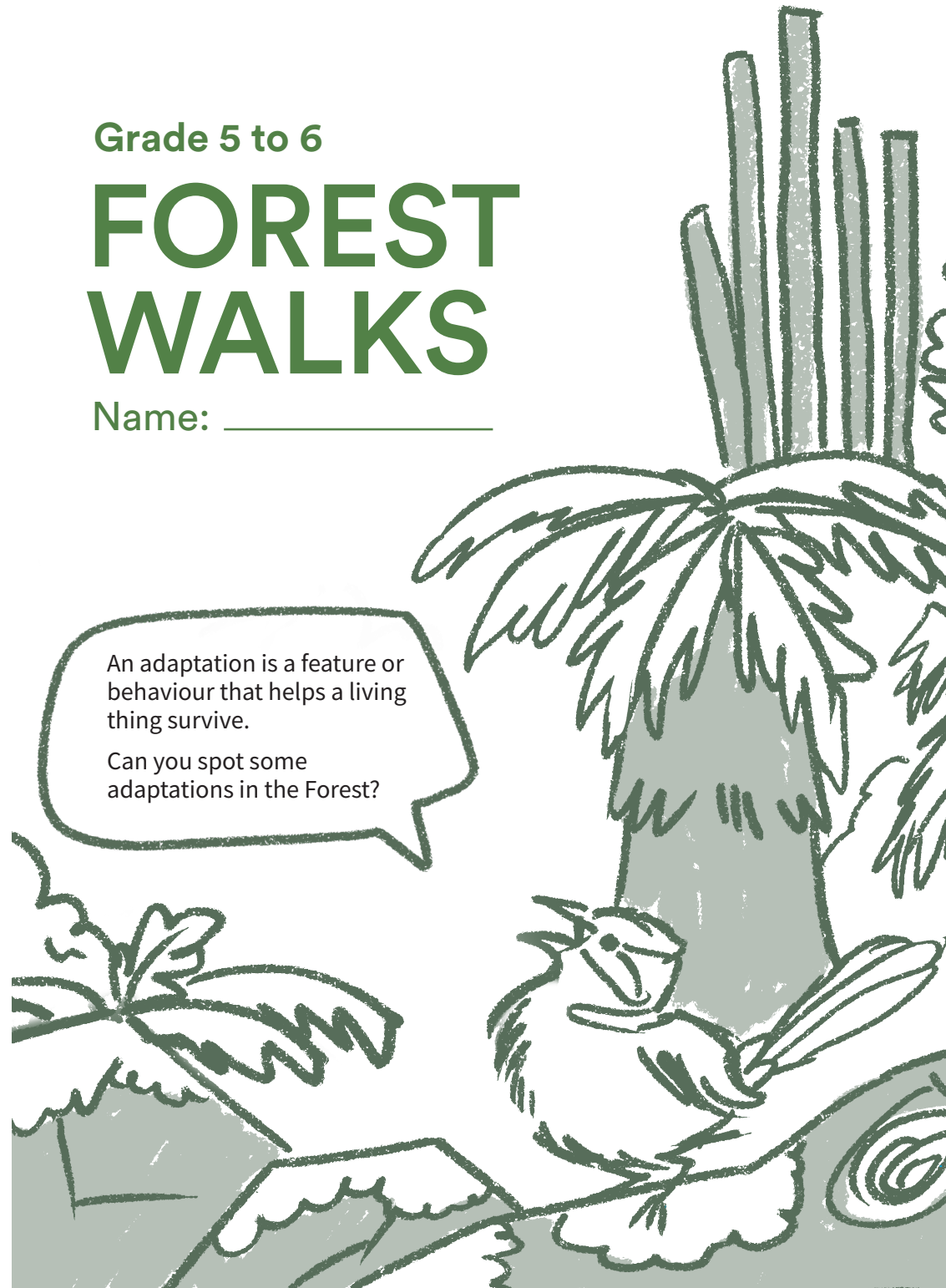

An adaptation is a feature or behaviour that helps a living thing survive.


Can you spot some adaptations in the Forest?

Look into the water. Pick one animal to draw.


Label its structural adaptations that help it survive.
